What is the Territorial Sea Plan

Oregon's Territorial Sea Plan (TSP) is a coordinated framework for managing the states ocean resources. It was originally adopted in 1994 with new parts being added as needed.

Part 1 – Ocean Management Framework

Part 2 – Making Resource Use Decisions

Part 3 – Rocky Shores Management Strategy

Part 4 – Uses of the Seafloor (telecommunication cables, pipelines, and other utilities)

Part 5 – Uses of the Seafloor (for development of marine renewable energy facilities)

The TSP was founded on Statewide Land Use Planning Goal 19 which outlines Oregon's Ocean Resources Goal –

“To conserve marine resources and ecological functions for the purpose of providing long-term ecological, economic, and social value and benefits to future generations.”

What is the Rocky Shores Management Strategy?

The Rocky Shores Management Strategy is the 3rd part of the broader Territorial Sea Plan. The Strategy is one of the original sections adopted in 1994 and focuses on coastal rocky habitat resources on shore and within the territorial sea.

Strategy Purpose Statement –

This strategy is a coordination and adaptive planning framework focused on the long term protection of ecological resources and coastal biodiversity within and among Oregon's rocky shores, while allowing appropriate use.
