To whom it may concern,

Ocean Policy Advisory Council (OPAC) is seeking applicants to serve on the Territorial Sea Plan (TSP) Part Four Working Group. This working group is tasked with amending Part four of the Territorial Sea Plan, the Uses of the Seafloor. OPAC is seeking applicants who can effectively represent one or more of the following interests:

- Conservation
- Education
- Submarine Cable Industry
- Commercial Fishing
- Coastal tourism
- Black/African American Oregonians
- Recreational Fishing
- · Coastal Research

- Local Government
- Indigenous perspectives
- Coastal residents
- Latino/a/x Oregonians
- Low income or other persons representing historically marginalized populations

Interested individuals please submit a letter of interest and resume using the subject line "TSP Part Four Working Group Application" (contact information below).

Ideal candidates will be Oregon residents who represent one or more of the interests listed above. Desirable attributes include familiarity with coastal resources, previous involvement with OPAC and/or OPAC working groups, and association with a group representing the listed interests as a member of a board, commission, sub-committee, or lived experience. Recruitment is ongoing until all vacancies are filled.

DLCD is inviting consultation with Oregon's nine federally recognized tribes during this amendment process. Tribal government representatives are welcome on the TSP Part Four Working Group, or to consult with DLCD formally or at a staff-to-staff level at any time.

The Territorial Sea Plan Part Four Working Group, a sub-committee of the Oregon Ocean Policy Advisory Council, is established to update and amend the Territorial Sea Plan Part Four. This long overdue amendment will incorporate up-to-date natural and social science, as well as public comment, to best determine future strategies for managing the siting of undersea utilities (telecommunications and power cables, pipelines, and other utilities) and associated landing sites. Current Working Group members represent, non-consumptive recreation, South Coast Commercial Fisheries, coastal conservation/environmental organizations, the public-at-large, and state and federal agencies.

Working Group members will meet for an estimated six (6) sessions (four to eight [4-8] hours each) between April 2022 and April 2023, and as needed during public scoping periods, to identify and draft management recommendations for adoption into the TSP. If you need financial support to participate in the Working Group please include your request for support with your

application materials. Travel support to attend meetings and workshops is available as well.
